Introduction


A Japanese word, Hado means "vibration". "Hado is the intrinsic vibrational pattern at the atomic level in all matter. It is the smallest unit of energy." 


RESULT

Photographing water crystals shows base water - "distilled water". The shape on the top was considered significant for base water.



The i9 bottle (Chakra Rainbow) has been filled with this distilled water for 2 hours. Afterwards the water drops have been frozen and photographed digitally under the microscope. The crystal shows the change of shape.

The crystal photo of i9 Bottle shows the significant change of shape in water crystal.
